Monday

Tuesday

Learn to write your address. Don't forget to use a capital letter for names of places! You could also learn the school's address and send a letter to Mrs Seymour who is in school every day!



Wednesday

Thursday

Remember to be gentle, put creatures back where you found them and wash your hands when you have finished.

Friday

Look the different houses and buildings around you. Take photos/ draw pictures and label them; e.g semi-detached, terraced, flats, detached. You could also use any spare cereal/shoe boxes to create a model of your home.
