## What do we expect from parents?

During this ongoing period of emergency school closure, we expect parents to ensure children complete the home learning tasks set for their class, which now include daily online maths and English lessons from the Oak National Academy. Children in Owl Class should work on these for at least two hours 15 minutes daily Monday – Friday.

A daily diary should be kept *by an adult* to record activities completed each day.

Parents should try to ensure that children remain physically active.

## Reading: 15 minutes

Twice a week, children should log on to Rising Stars and complete one of the two online Cracking Comprehension tasks set for them. For the other three days, children should read with an adult and answer questions (see school website for question suggestions); e-books are available on Curriculum Visions, via the school website and on the Oxford Owl website.

## English: 30 minutes

Children should access the lesson for the day set on Oak National Academy, which should take approximately 30 minutes to complete. Over the week, the five lessons will typically include a range of reading, phonics and spelling, grammar and writing activities.

## Spellings: 20 minutes

Children in Year 1 should watch the daily lesson on the DfE Letters and Sounds YouTube channel. A new lesson is uploaded daily.

We have extended our subscription to Spellzone so that, from Week 2, children in Year 2 will be able to log on to Spellzone (log in details will be sent out beforehand) and work on their pathways tasks for the set time.

## Mathematics: 30 minutes

Children should access the lesson for the day set on the Oak National Academy, which will take approximately 30 minutes.

### Independent Learning Project: 40 minutes

Children now have a wider choice of activities that they can follow. This choice includes: (i) their own independent learning project; (ii) following the Oak National Academy's foundation lesson; or (iii) taking inspiration from the activities set out in the weekly Owl Class Letter.

**Talk At Ten** will continue for pupils not attending school. From Week 2, small groups of pupils in each year group not attending school will be invited to participate in 20 minute **Teams At Two** video calls facilitated by members of staff. These will provide children with opportunities to share their home learning and spend some time with others in their year group; groupings will change so that they get the chance to meet up with different classmates each time. Once children begin attending school, this provision will cease. Protocol on this provision will be provided in due course, and must be agreed by parents in order for pupils to participate.
